DRY ERASE COATINGS

Overview

Dry erase coatings convert interior surfaces into durable, erasable writing areas suitable for commercial, educational, and office environments.

Initial Use

- Allow the coating to fully cure before writing on the surface.
- Premature use may result in ghosting or surface damage.
- Use standard dry erase markers. Avoid low odor or low VOC dry erase markers.

Daily Cleaning

- Use dry erase markers intended for coated writing surfaces only.
- Erase regularly using dry erasers or soft cloths.
- Clean periodically with approved dry erase cleaners or mild soap and water.

Stain & Residue Management

- Remove marker residue promptly to prevent staining or ghosting.
- Avoid abrasive pads, scouring powders, or acidic cleaners that can scratch or dull the surface.

Long-Term Maintenance

- Periodic deep cleaning may be required in high-use areas.
- Inspect for scratches or wear; recoating may be necessary if performance is reduced.
- Recoat following the instructions listed on the products technical data sheet (TDS).
